While scrapbook designs and layouts are a very subjective issue, perhaps more guidance can be gained from looking at some information on Scrapbooking from the Web.

Is it Organized?

Does it flow from point A to point B, Start to Finish?

Does it have a Common Theme?

Is it about Your Camp as a whole, is it about the past year, or is it about a special event?

Does it tell a Story?

Can the reader determine the purpose of the scrapbook?

Do you identify your Photos?

Do you identify your pictures as to who's in them, or what they're about?

Placement of Page Elements

Does your scrapbook have a unified look, does it take the viewer on a journey?

Does your scrapbook use Page Titles?

A page title can highlight or support the page theme or topic.

Do you use "Journaling"?

Does it contain an assortment of articles, pictures, and information to make it a scrapbook and not just a photo album.

Dressing Up with Embellishments

Embellishments can enhance your page as interesting decorative pieces. If you want to add dimension, glitz or texture to your page, try adding on an embellishment or two.
