1851 Brass Frame Confederate Griswold & Gunnison

Pietta 1851 Confederate Navy Black Powder Revolver

This six-shot .44 caliber revolver was made under contract to the Confederate government. **It is a brass framed copy of the Colt 1851 Navy revolver.** Connecticut Yankee Samuel Griswold set up a cotton gin factory in Georgia in 1830. The village of Griswoldville grew around the factory. In 1862, Griswold produced pikes for volunteers from the state of Georgia. The factory soon began producing revolvers for the Confederacy. No other Confederate factory produced more revolvers than Griswold & Gunnison. Griswoldville was the first town burned by Sherman's troops on his march to the sea. This 1851 navy model features a brass frame, blued parts, brass backstrap and triggerguard, hexagon barrel, and a walnut navy size grip. ***A beautiful replica to add to your collection!***

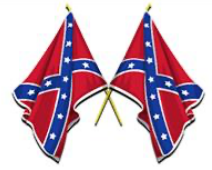

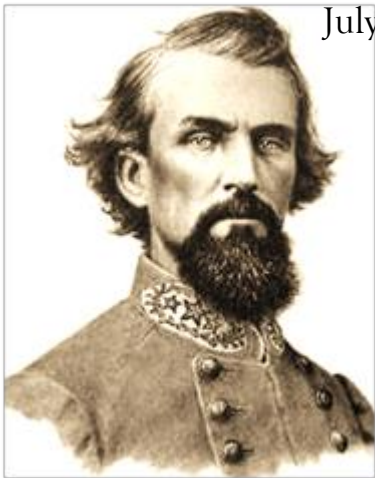

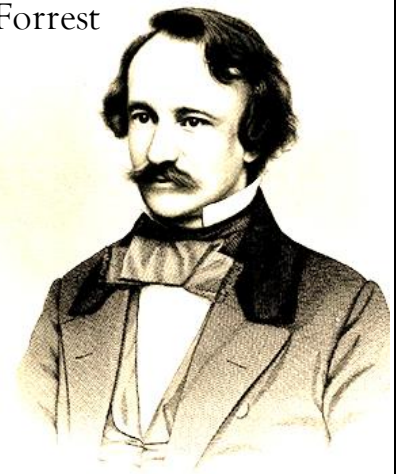
Birthdates

- July 4, 1828 Brigadier General James Johnston Pettigrew
- July 10, 1833 Brigadier General Lucius Eugene Polk
- July 12, 1821 Lieutenant General Daniel Harvey Hill
- July 13, 1821 Lieutenant General Nathan Bedford Forrest

That Devil Forrest, the Wizard of the Saddle! July 13, 1821- October 29, 1877

A prominent and wealthy Southern planter, Forrest enlisted in the CSA on July 14, 1861. Promoted July 1862 to brigadier general and given command of a cavalry brigade that he supplied at his own expense.

Forrest posted ads to join his regiment for *"Men with good horse & good gun"* adding, *"If you want to have some fun & kill some Yankees!"*

Confederate chaplain, George Stainback, declared in his eulogy: *"Lieutenant-General Nathan Bedford Forrest, though dead, yet speaketh. His acts have photographed themselves upon the hearts of thousands, and will speak from there forever!"*

James Johnston Pettigrew 4 July 1828-17 July 1863

In 1847, James Johnston Pettigrew graduated from the University of North Carolina at the top of his class. An esteemed student known for his intellect when the war began, he joined the 22nd North Carolina Regiment as colonel.

In July 1863, Pettigrew led the charge up the left side of Cemetery Ridge at Gettysburg. The losses in Pettigrew's division were staggering, leaving only eighty men standing out of the eight hundred who began the battle. A week later, Pettigrew died from wounds received during the Confederate retreat at Falling Waters. In 1912, the university named a building for him.
