

#### **Commanders Report**



The camp was privileged to have **Sheran Weible**, **UDC Texas Division Recorder of Military Service Awards**, as our special guest speaker from

Stephenville. Mrs. Weible's presentation was very informative and included how SCV members can apply for UDC War Service medals. Mrs. Weible said there are three classifications of medals that the United Daughters of the Confederacy award: Cross of Military Service, National Defense Medal, and Armed Forces Expeditionary Service Medal. All the medals require the recipient be a lineal descendants of Confederate

military personnel and serve at least 90 days in the US Armed Services. Cost of these medals are covered by the local UDC Chapters at \$100 each. Our camp has several compatriots eligible for these medals and will begin the process for qualifying for awards. It is a great honor to each of our camp veterans to receive these special medals.

The Calendar of Events for 2025 was reviewed and certain events assigned to camp members for coordination. April will be a full and active month since we will be celebrating Confederate Heritage Month. Please review the Events listed on page 7 and make plans to be a part of these activities.



### Maj. Gen. Patrick Cleburne Confederate Irish Hero





We propose no invasion of the North, no attack on them, and only ask to be left alone."







#### **Camp Birthdays**

Happy Birthday Camp Chaplain <u>Allen Glanville</u>, March 31st! Allen has been a member of the SCV since 2023. His ancestor Orren Lemon Jackson, born 1834 & deceased 1890, Edgecombe, Nash County, North Carolina, enlisted 1862 with 13th North Carolina Batt., Co. D, and elected 1st Sgt. He was later reassigned to 66th Regt N.C. Infantry and fought under Gen. Joseph Johnson. Orren is Jonathan "Stonewall" Jackson's 3rd cousin 2X removed.

#### **BOOK REVIEW**

#### <u>Houston Displayed, or, Who Won the Battle of San Jacinto?</u>

By Robert M. Coleman, edited with an introduction by Stephen L. Hardin.

In 1837 a slender 38 page pamphlet purportedly written by "A Farmer in the Army" appeared on the scene in the early days of the Republic of Texas. It had been printed in Velasco and the author had dared to assert that General Sam Houston (now the President) had almost nothing to do with achieving military victory, that he had tried to avoid combat, and that he had finally fought only because the rank-and-file demanded it. The anonymous author also cast many personal asper-



sions on Houston's conduct and character—alleging drunkenness, drug abuse, erratic behavior, and even an attempted suicide. Needless to say, Sam Houston was not amused. He knew that Robert M. Coleman, who had served as a colonel on Houston's general staff, was the likely author. He had Coleman thrown in jail and had his political associates engage in what we today call "damage control." Think of this age as an early Texas political swamp. Sometimes "Truth is stranger than fiction" or the official narrative is not all that its purported to be. The original 1837 Velasco edition is extremely rare: only five copies have survived in public institutions (Yale, the University of Texas, Austin Public Library, Sam Houston State University, and the J.P. Bryan Museum in Galveston). It was reprinted in facsimile in 1964 by the **Brick Row Book Shop** in Austin, with an introduction by John H. Jenkins—and even this edition is hard to locate today. The new edition, number 13 in the Library of Texas series, offers readers a scholarly introduction by Professor Stephen L. Hardin, an accurate text and explanatory footnotes, a bibliography, and an index. It was printed in an edition of 500 copies. At \$40 and 132 pages, it offers more than the original 38-page pamphlet, in a handsome and legible typeface! This edited original is an essential reference for any Texas collection.




