



New Texas Monument Placed in Richmond, Virginia

We witnessed a remarkable event this past Friday, November 15, 2024. Texas Division Commander Michael Hurley, assisted by several members from the Virginia Division of the Sons of Confederate Veterans, erected a replacement monument dedicated to Texas soldiers buried at historic Oakwood Cemetery in Richmond, Virginia. The original monument, a symbol of their bravery, was established in the 1910s by the local Ladies Memorial Association. For unknown reasons, the monument disappeared over 60 years ago, but the dedication of the Texas Division Sons of Confederate Veterans has brought it back to life.

In September 2023, the Division Executive Council approved funding for creating a replacement obelisk. Due to the high shipping cost, Commander Hurley picked up the monument on Wednesday, November 13, in Marshall, TX, and personally delivered it to Pichmond. VA. The drive was

and personally delivered it to Richmond, VA. The drive was a 34-hour round-trip drive.





Special thanks to the members of the Texas Division Sons of Confederate Veterans. Your annual dues to the Division funded the monument that proudly stands over the graves of our brave Texas soldiers, who paid the ultimate price in defense of Texas.

A formal dedication will be held in March 2025. This dedication will be a joint effort of the Texas and Virginia Divisions of the Sons of Confederate Veterans. Once the date has been solidified, information on the dedication will be sent to the Division membership.

Hulsey's 3rd Great-Grandfather, Marcus Lafayette Keener, was born in 1831 and deceased on Nov 18, 1870. He served as a Texas Ranger


and was listed as a private on the Muster Roll of Rangers in 1860 under Captain William C. Clayton's Company A, 1st Frontier District. His duties likely involved safeguarding the frontier, maintaining law and order, and protecting settlers from threats such as outlaws, Native American raids, and other dangers. He was living on the Brazos River, west of

present day Weatherford. He was a
Master Mason and he was buried with
Masonic rites. Marcus passed away
while hauling lumber from east Texas
to build the town of Weatherford in Parker County, Texas. He is buried in the
Old Chatfield Cemetery in Chatfield,
Navarro County, Texas. His brothers


were Andrew Jackson Keener, Co. F, 11th Georgia Calvary and John F Keener Co. F, 52nd Georgia Calvary also a POW during the Battle of Vicksburg.



Arlington Monument and Military Base Names—Time to Act

Gentlemen:

The recent election proves beyond a doubt that Americans in general and, in overwhelming numbers, Southerners in particular, have rejected the neo-Marxists woke agenda. 
